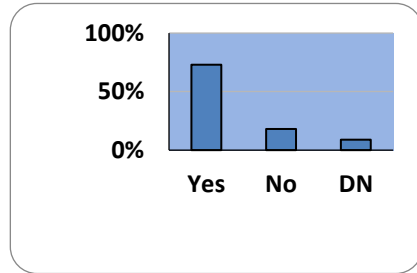
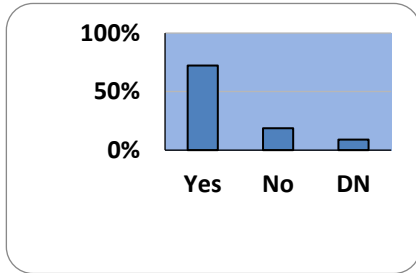
A4. Freshford Mill: To continue discussions with the administrators/owners to encourage the inclusion of this site for mixed use purposes such as affordable housing and workshops.

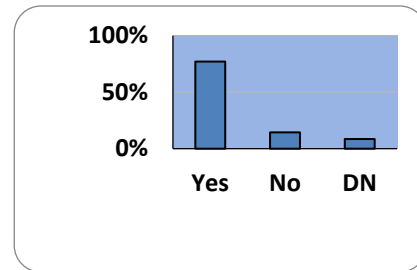
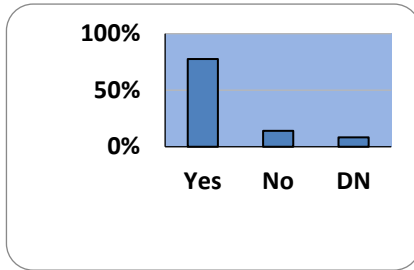


C4. Gateways: Create carefully-designed 'gateways' at all village road entry points (for example
