WILTSHIRE MUSIC CENTRE

Wiltshire Music Centre (WMC) in Bradford on Avon, which attracts worldrenowned performers from all musical genres, has been awarded more than

£300K by Arts Council England, to be spread over the next three years.

James Slater, WMC's Chief Executive, said: "This award demonstrates the value that is placed on our work, that we are delivering the very highest quality cultural experiences for our community, and that we have the ambition and determination to reach new audiences."

Culture Secretary and Chippenham MP, Michelle Donelan, who has long supported and campaigned for additional funding, said: "... the Wiltshire Music Centre really is a unique, world-renowned hub for education, with over 800 musicians rehearsing there every single week".

The grant will enable the award-winning concert venue to continue to present over 150 live concerts and events a year, as well as its Creative Learning Programme for over 5,000 children throughout the region.

In total, seven organisations in Wiltshire will receive a share of more than £2.2m a year, ensuring more people can find fulfilling art and culture on their doorsteps.

Limpley Stoke boundary change proposal

The Boundary Commission for England (BCE) is currently carrying out a boundary review to re-balance the number of electors represented by each MP.

It is proposed that **Limpley Stoke** be moved out of the Chippenham Constituency – currently held by Michelle Donelan, MP – into that serving Melksham and Devizes.

Wiltshire's Chief Constable to retire

Wiltshire's Chief Constable, Kier Pritchard, has announced his intention to retire in June 2023 after 30 years' service.

Mr Pritchard, who has been Chief Constable since March 2018, said: "I have served with Wiltshire Police for my entire career. The opportunity to lead this force as chief has been the greatest privilege of my professional career.

"It really has been an honour serving the communities of Wiltshire. This county is very close to my heart – it is my home, it is where my family have grown up, and it is also where I followed in the footsteps of my late father in joining Wiltshire Police at the age of 19 in 1993. Taken together, we have provided over 60 years of continued public service."

As one of the longest-serving chief constables in the force's recent history, Mr Pritchard started in post just as a major incident was declared in Salisbury following the Novichok nerve agent attack, the largest major incident the force and local partners had experienced, which dominated global news for many months.


