Lamp Proposals - taking into account survey results

The results of the survey have been looked through and the main points have been compiled.

Requests have been made for the following lights, which were proposed to be switched off, to be kept:

There were three requests for light 32 to be removed (all from people who live by it).

There were 15 requests from residents who think we are turning off too few lights.

It's suggested that the following lights are reinstated- 22 - 23 - 33 - 36 - 37 - 6A and 7. These all had six votes or more.

Consideration could be given to taking out light 32, this had three votes to remove from residents who are directly affected by this light being so close to their homes, and light 33 is now being reinstated which is close to this light.

Please see additional map showing the revised proposals for which street lamps will be left on.

There were also a number of responses suggesting shortening the time that the lights were on. Instead of reducing the time the lights are on, we could achieve an energy saving by following BANES residential dimming regime, which is as follows (although their lights stay on between midnight and 05:30 whereas lights in Freshford switch off):

Light output	100% between dusk and 22.00
Reducing to	50% between 22:00 and 23:00
Then down to	10% between 23:00 and midnight
Back on at	50% between 05:30 and 07:00
And then back to	100% between 07:00 and dawn

Some Freshford lights have shading fitted to them to protect houses nearby. It's proposed that full shading is fitted to all the lights to reduce light pollution, as in the picture below.
