number of incidents have been recorded recently in the Bradford on Avon and Holt areas where doorstep traders have carried out unnecessary work, falsely claimed to have completed jobs, or deliberately damaged properties to make more work.

People have also been overcharged for jobs undertaken or been relieved of their hard-earned cash when nothing has been done.

In some instances, rogue traders have driven the victim to a bank or cashpoint to obtain money under duress, or bullied and victimised vulnerable consumers into having work done and paying for it.

Wiltshire Police and trading standards officers strongly advise consumers never to agree to buy anything from 'cold callers'. Anyone who has already agreed to have work done by a trader who knocked on your door may be able to cancel their contract with no further payments and could be entitled to a refund within a 14-day cooling off period.

You can report any cold calling by doorstep traders and canvassers to the police non-emergency number 101, or call Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133. If you have vulnerable and/or elderly neighbours, please keep an eye out and report anything suspicious to 101.

# Wiltshire home for Ukrainian family

he first Ukrainian family has moved into a new home in Wiltshire as part of a council scheme to provide support for refugees from the war. The council is using government funding to purchase 24 homes across Wiltshire to house Ukrainian families and offering further support as they take the next steps into finding their own housing and moving on from their host families.

Wiltshire has welcomed 1,450 guests into the county so far and is one of the top authorities in England for taking in Ukrainian nationals due to the war. Of the Ukrainians who have settled in Wiltshire, 173 families have now moved into private rented accommodation, while the council's Homes for Ukraine team has secured 83 re-matches with new hosts from within Wiltshire plus a further 27 who have been matched into Wiltshire from other local authorities.

Councillor Richard Clewer, Leader of Wiltshire Council. said: "These homes are for the families who are in desperate need. We are no doubt one of the first councils in the country to provide homes in this way.

"We know that in Wiltshire there are people looking for housing and finding it difficult. While this government funding has to be used specifically for Ukraine people now, longer term it is an investment for Wiltshire residents, providing more housing stock for the future", he added.



Small, rechargeable electrical items can now be recycled as part of your fortnightly kerbside collection service, including electric toothbrushes; shavers/trimmers; Smart watches; mobile phones; digital cameras; charging devices/power banks; and wireless earphones.

These items should be placed in a carrier bag next to your blue-lidded bin.

Items that will **not** be collected include any mains-powered electrical item that needs to be plugged in, or individual rechargeable items larger than a shoe box.

### Changes to kerbside recycling

Wiltshire's recycling rules have changed. Textiles and shredded paper will no longer be collected for recycling at the kerbside. Good quality reusable clothing and textiles can be taken to a charity shop, household recycling centre or clothing bank.

Shredded paper can be composted, taken to a household recycling centre or left in the general household waste bin but should not be put in the garden waste bin as it is unsuitable for the large-scale composting process.
